

Marjory Pollock Hibner March 13, 1918 – Jan. 20, 2007



Marjory Pollack Hibner, age 88, passed away on Saturday, Jan. 20, 2007, at the Don and Marilyn Anderson Hospice Care Center. Marjory was born March 13, 1918, the daughter of Charles and Lillian Pollock. She was a lifelong resident of Madison and graduated from East High School. Marjory graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1940, along with her

future husband, George Hibner. They were married in 1942, while George was on leave from the Army. While George was in Europe during World War II, Marjory worked for the Morey Aircraft Co. at Truax Field, where they were training pilots for the Army Air Corp. Marjory and George settled in Madison where they raised their daughters, Kary Hibner of Verona, and Dany (George Szabo) of Columbia Station, Ohio. She is also survived by her adored and adoring grandson, Ashton Cerioni, also of Ohio. Marjory worked for many years at the UW Verona Family Practice Clinic and also at Meriter Hospital. She was also very active as a volunteer at Meriter, logging in more than 7000 hours of volunteer service. In earlier years she was quite active in her college alumni sorority group, Alpha Xi Delta, and an active member of the PEO. A life long Liberal, she loved a "lively political discussion", especially with her "big brother" Fred, whose opinions had a tendency to vary widely from hers. These "discussions" are the "stuff" of family lore. She is also survived by her "big brother", Fred C. Fredrick Pollock of Madison who was at her side always during her brief illness. Also surviving, are her nieces and nephews, Diane Pollock, Rick Pollock, Patrick and Joyce Pollock, Greg Pollock, and Lynn Heiman.
